

Your small leather good has been carefully created following time-honored traditions of craftsmanship and creativity. Each piece is designed with the utmost attention to quality and detail. Your product comes with an authenticity certificate, which is important to keep. The number of the certificate is also registered on the inside of the item.

YOUR PRODUCT SHOULD BE TREATED WITH CARE.

- To preserve the shape and protect the elegant lines of the article, do not overfill it. If the item contains credit card slots, we recommend that you do not insert more than one card per slot.
- Do not expose the leather to sun or humidity for prolonged periods of time. Avoid contact with makeup, perfume or any chemical.
- If the article becomes wet, then dry by dabbing the item with an absorbent cloth that does not pill. Avoid rubbing the surface, which could alter the shade of the leather.
- For pale colors, avoid prolonged contact and rubbing against other materials.
- When not in use, place the leather good in its original packaging. Stuff with tissue paper, if necessary, to retain the original shape. If the item has chain straps, cover the chains so that they do not leave marks on the leather.
- Any use of chemical or cleaning products could alter the finish of metal pieces.

EACH TYPE OF MATERIAL REQUIRES SPECIFIC CARE.

- Lambskin: This material is left unprotected intentionally to preserve the natural suppleness of the leather. Therefore, they develop a patina over time, and are sensitive to humidity and repeated rubbing with other fabrics.
- Metallic leather: This is a fragile and delicate material. The metallic finish can fade with use, particularly on the corners and edges.
- Patent leather: This is leather covered with a glossy varnish, yet it remains

delicate. Ensure that the item does not have extended contact with dark materials, as they are likely to stain it. We recommend that you avoid exposing your leather good to prolonged light, as this could alter the color over time. This is a natural phenomenon linked to the pigments used to varnish the leather.

- Nubuck leather: This is a delicate material that could transfer color to other materials. We recommend you avoid prolonged contact and repeated rubbing with other colored fabrics.
- Tweed: This fabric is delicate. We recommend you avoid prolonged contact and repeated friction with abrasive or colored materials.
- Exotic leather: This type of leather is particularly sensitive to humidity. If the article becomes wet, then dry it immediately by dabbing with an absorbent cloth that does not pill. Do not use cleaning or restoration products, or cosmetic cleansers.
- Natural fur or faux fur: This material may thin over time.
- Embroidered jewelry, sequins and strass: These delicate embellishments have been crafted using artisanal techniques and should be handled with care.
